Elmer Bundy, 88, of Estherville passed away Monday, January 22, 2018 at Lakes Regional Health Care in Spirit Lake.

Funeral services will be held at 11:00 a.m. Monday, January 29, 2018 at the Schuchert-Lentz Funeral Home in Spirit Lake with military funeral honors conducted by the American Legion Timpe Post #23 and the John W. Kidd VFW Post #4514. Burial will be in the Memory Gardens Cemetery in Spirit Lake. A visitation will be held on Sunday, January 28, 2018 from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the funeral home.
