



Forrest "Frosty" Cobb

April 18, 1931 - December 16, 2023

Forrest "Frosty" Newell Cobb, age 92, of Spirit Lake, Iowa, passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on December 16, 2023, at Holy Spirit Nursing Home in Sioux City, Iowa.

Visitation will be on December 30, 2023, from 12:30 to 2:00 followed by a funeral service at 2:00 at Robinson Funeral Home in Spirit Lake, Iowa. Burial will be held at Lake View Gardens Cemetery in Spirit Lake, Iowa.

Frosty was born on April 18, 1931, in Russell, Iowa, to Carson and Marjorie (Newell) Cobb.

He grew up in Tipton, Iowa, where he attended Tipton High School. He graduated from

Coe College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. On August 3, 1952, he married Delores (Dee) Bristley of Conrad, Iowa. Frosty served in the US Air Force from 1954 to 1962, during which time they were stationed in several different cities across the United States and in Germany. They were blessed with 5 children and settled in Le Mars, Iowa, where Frosty taught 9th grade English for 25 years and coached Junior High football and basketball before retiring in 1991.

He was active in playing handball, softball, and tennis and also enjoyed

hunting, fishing, boating, camping, daily walks, playing cards and board games and singing around the campfire at his beloved lake home...but most of all, he loved spending time with his family.

Left to cherish his memory are his three daughters and their husbands: Cindy and Mark Mammen of Sioux City, Iowa, Cay and Dee Jay Donlin of Orange City, Iowa, and Carla and Brent Dyhrkopp of Graettinger, Iowa; daughter-in-law: Becky Cobb of Knoxville, Iowa;

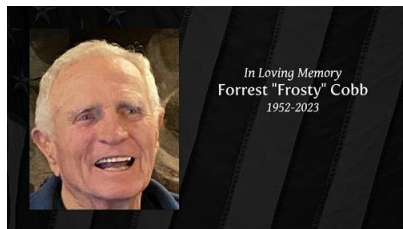

Mr. Cobb was the teacher who one day, realized that all of us were quiet but were waaaay too distracted by the snow falling. So, he calmly announced a five-minute break where every one of us had full permission to just sit and continue quietly watching out the window. Sure enough, five minutes later, we got back to listening to his regularly-scheduled lesson. It worked; I was able to concentrate for the rest of the period. Thanks, Mr. Cobb.
