



## Robert "Bobcat" Anderson

April 2, 1950 - November 21, 2013

Robert L. "Bobcat" Anderson, age 63, of Terril, Iowa, passed away Thursday, November 21, 2013, at Lakes Regional Healthcare in Spirit Lake, Iowa. He was born on April 2, 1950, in Minneapolis, MN, to Lewis and Verna (Kerkhoff) Anderson. He grew up in Morgan, MN, and graduated from Morgan High School in 1968.
